

    - Rhea County Courthouse The restored Romanesque Revival-Italian villa-style courthouse was built in 1891 and designated a National Historic Landmark in 1977. The Scopes Trial courtroom is on the second floor and contains the original judge's bench, four tables, railing, jury chairs, and spectator seats.





- Memphis, TN
  - National Civil Rights Museum Located at the Lorraine Motel, where Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated, this museum chronicles the Civil Rights Movement and the fight for free speech and equal rights.
- Philadelphia, PA
  - National Constitution Center On September 6, 2023, the National Constitution Center will open its newest gallery, The First Amendment. Protecting some of our most cherished freedoms—religious liberty, free speech, a free press, the freedom of assembly, and the right to petition the First Amendment is a pillar of democracy and the American way. The gallery will offer a fresh perspective on the history of the First Amendment and how it impacts us today.
  - Independence Hall As the birthplace of the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution, Independence Hall symbolizes the foundational principles of free speech and democracy.

  - National Mall and Memorial Parks The National Mall is home to numerous monuments and memorials that commemorate important figures and events in American history, including those associated with free speech, such as the Lincoln Memorial and the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial.
